

#### DRAMATURGY NOTE

Doreen Green is the crime-fighting, butt-kicking, unbeatable Squirrel Girl and she has to face her biggest challenge yet...going to college. In *Squirrel Girl Goes to College*, Doreen must balance being a normal girl making new friends in a new school with the superhero who saves the world. As she struggles to keep her identity hidden, she learns that superpowers are about more than strength and agility, it's about having the courage to trust your friends and be yourself!

Squirrel Girl might be a new superhero, but superheroes themselves have been around for a while and are deeply entrenched in our culture. Even those who aren't avid Marvel fans have probably encountered the likes of Spider-Man or Superman or Wonder Woman. Since the first superhero comic was published in 1938, America has latched onto the idea of a powerful figure who can leap tall buildings and fly through the air. Superhero stories are exciting because you get to see people who have special powers fight off bad guys, but what is equally as important in superhero stories is the ways that they are normal people. When Peter Parker isn't being Spider-Man, he's a nerdy high schooler with a crush on a girl. When Bruce Banner isn't being the Hulk, he's an introverted scientist. T'Challa and Shuri are the king and princess of Wakanda, and they also bicker like normal siblings. Similar to all these other superheroes, Doreen is both the superhero Squirrel Girl and a friendly, computer-science loving college student.

Squirrel Girl Goes to College shows a classic conflict within superhero stories, bigger than any supervillain, which is grappling with having a superhero self and a completely separate alter ego. What this play explores is the contradictions within people, and how Squirrel Girl is not a different form of Doreen Green, but an essential part of herself. It can be scary and confusing and embarrassing to navigate all the things that make up yourself, and sometimes it can feel like you have your own superhero self and alter ego. Squirrel Girl shows that those conflicting personas are not a weakness or a burden, but an important strength. Whether it's making friends or defeating Doctor Doom, Doreen Green can only succeed when she has the confidence to be her entire self, awkward dance moves and all!

Within this production, the word "freak" is used frequently, often by or in reference to the character of the same name. Freak is a Marvel character with several iterations throughout the years. The production team acknowledges that the term "freak" has a long history as a derogatory term, specifically towards people with mental and/or physical disabilities. It is also a term embraced by many in the comic world in relation to mutation, embracing uniqueness, and/or being a "freak of nature." For this production, we began the conversation about this term during the season selection process. The committee, whose members included people who identified as disabled, discussed the origin of the character name, how the term was used in the play, and the opportunity for discussion. The conversation continued in the rehearsal room with the entire company. The origin story of this character who is mutated and evolves into a villain has a different path in this play and is ultimately embraced for their uniqueness. We specifically worked to ensure that the character of Freak in no way represents a person with a disability and that the characters in the play do not use the word with derogatory intentions. We chose to only say the word in rehearsal as written in the text in acknowledgment of the history of the word. Words have power. While we cannot erase them, we can continue the conversation about the words we choose to say and how they affect others.

We discussed the challenges of the world we are living in, we named hopes and fears, and we embraced the comedy in the script to laugh along the way.

In this imperfect production, in this imperfect world, with so much work to do, we invite you to reflect and ask yourself: What is your superpower?
