



DRAMATURGY NOTE

"Screaming all around me. But me? I breathe." -Kamal, Tall Enough

Have you ever felt fear? Hands shaking, heart racing, fight-or-flight kind of fear. In such turbulent times, you likely have. Fear is one of the seven universal emotions all humans experience. However, not all fears are the same. Some fears, like heights and the dark, come from the survival instinct humans have to protect themselves from danger. Other fears, such as Asia's fear of rollercoasters, comes from situations our brains deem hazardous.

While fear can be destabilizing, it is also a natural and necessary safety measure we take instinctually to protect ourselves. Fear begins in the mind and ripples out into the body so that we can respond swiftly to dangerous situations. The connection between the mind and the body in moments of fear can be our greatest asset.

When we experience fear, our first instinct is to fight, run, or freeze. When encountering fear about going on the Thunderbeast, Asia's first instinct was to freeze. Yet, even with so much fear, it is through using the breath that Asia faced that fear. Even when we have nothing else, we have our breath: the life force that keeps us alive and soothes our nervous system. To put it in scientific terms, the vagus nerve is what connects our brains to our bodies. When we begin to deepen our breath, the vagus nerve sends a signal to the brain that it is time to relax. Our minds and our bodies are in constant communication with one another, so when we are able to use our breath, something physical, it translates into using our brain, something mental. Fear causes our minds to race, telling us the only way to not get hurt is to keep moving. Even so, we experience peace from slowing down and breathing, much like how Asia was able to move through fear. The next time you are feeling that hands shaking, heart racing, fight-or-flight fear, take Kamal's advice and breathe.
