# DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Welcome to Three Antarcticas.

Here, at the end of the earth, people are breaking binary ways of thinking and being. Grandiose ambitions collide with an uncaring landscape, over three time periods, in the same ramshackle hut. Our daring characters travel to get away, to stake their claim, to be transformed. Honestly, who do they think they are?

As you experience the bravery, rigor, delusions, and heartbreak of these characters, I hope you'll see parts of yourself reflected onstage like I have seen myself. There we are, going about our business, hoping to be part of the solution, unsure of what's next, scared of change, and experiencing the end of the world as we know it. Going, going, gone.

Every moment is full of complex mystery. This play, however, is not interested in answers. Instead, we'd like to offer you precious reflection and moments of stillness amidst the majesty of the planet and the great unknowns. Perhaps, surrounded by the wonder of it all, we'll get to see our part and each other in a new light.

#### DRAMATURGY NOTE

As we begin to traverse the mysterious and distant world of Antarctica, this three-act play opens not with the beginnings of a grand expedition, or treacherous conditions that must be bested, but a rehearsal for a play. This meta-theatric convention sets in motion a theme throughout all three of the Antarcticas explored: community and joy. While it may seem counterintuitive in a story that so poignantly highlights the climate crisis and the risks that Antarctica is facing, joy is intricately weaved through the characters of this narrative, and it helps in a deeper understanding of a setting far removed from our own. Antarctica is thought of as a lasting wilderness, a place untouched by humans, when in reality it is a place deeply impacted by human beings. In fact, while there is a considerable amount of humanity versus nature within this play, there is also a large focus on humanity AS nature, showing how we are tied to the world around us, and how Antarctica is as much a part of our world as any other place is. As Robert Falcon Scott states, "we're all a part of it."

The idea of the individual's "carbon footprint" comes from a BP advertising initiative. It was a concept manufactured and publicized by oil companies to shift the blame for climate change off of the corporations and onto the individual. We are told that we each carry the weight of our planet on our individual shoulders. The pressure is immobilizing. Our play follows three groups of people who are facing down forces that they cannot stand up to alone, and instead of freezing, they reach out. Communities have immense power to make change happen, especially on a local level. Change comes in small pieces built from everyone working together. Ask yourself: What are you good at? What brings you joy? How can you bring those skills and that joy into your community? One person, not even the second man to reach Antarctica, can fix everything on their own. But whether you are a poet, a navigator, a scientist, or a playwright, there is a space for you in this fight, and will need each other to make it through this storm.
